Pop Quiz (and answers)

- 1) For whom is Bodega Bay named?
- a: Named for Lt. Don Juan Francisco de la Bodega y Quadra y Mollinedo, a Peruvian enlisted in the Royal Spanish Navy. His 36-foot long sloop with a crew of 17 anchored at the southern end of Bodega Bay in 1775. They were returning to Alaska. While he 'captained' the sloop, as a non-Spaniard he was not permitted to hold the rank of captain.
- 2) What was it's name before 1943?
- a: Before 1943, the town of Bodega Bay was known as 'Bay.'
- 3) How many Native American Tribes were in Sonoma County in the 1800s? Can you name them?
- a: Main groupings were Pomo, Coast Miwok, Yukia, Wappo, Suysune, and Sotoyome
- 4) How many flags flew over Bodega Bay before it was annexed to California?
- a: Six different flags: Spanish, English, Russian, Mexican, the Bear Flag (for several weeks), and since July
- 9, 1846, the American Flag.
- 5) If is the last star in the 'Stars and Stripes' Flag, which number star represents?
- a: was added to the flag when it became a state on July 4, 1851 -- giving the flag its 31st star (now star #31 in a field of 50 stars). It was 10 months after she had been admitted as a state on September 9, 1850.
- 6) In modern times, Bodega Bay was known around the world as the setting of Alfred Hitchcock's "The Birds." When was the film released and who was the featured star?
- a: 1963 and Tippi Hedren
